### Bluefish Amendment Proposed

Bluefish is managed jointly by the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission (ASMFC) and the Mid-Atlantic Fishery Management Council (MAFMC).

Currently 83% of the resource is allocated to recreational fisheries and 17% to commercial fisheries.

However, the commercial quota can be increased up to 10.5 million pounds if the recreational fishery is projected to not land its entire allocation for the upcoming year. (which usually happens)

The commercial fishery is controlled by state-by-state quotas based on historic landings from 1981-1989, while the recreational fishery is managed using a 15 fish bag limit.



At its joint meeting last month the ASMFC and MAFMC initiated a new amendment to the Bluefish Fishery Management Plan. The intent of the Draft Amendment is to review, and possibly revise the commercial/recreational allocation, as well as the distribution of the commercial quota among the states. A scoping document will be released something in 2018.

*Editor's Note: Because most recreational anglers prefer to release their bluefish to catch another day, those fish shouldn't automatically be handed over to the commercial fishery to kill anyway. If a reallocation happens, then we need to make sure that the recreational catch, released or not, isn't transferred away.*
